St John Vianney - the Curé d'Ar

'God's power is made perfect in weakness' wrote St Paul. Hearing that, who can say that God does not have a sense of humour? It would seem that he could not have chosen a much weaker weapon 'to confound the strong' than Jean-Baptiste Mary Vianney. Born in 1786 at Dardilly, a village not far from Lyons in south-eastern France, no-one could have predicted that he would one day be a priest who had become so famous that his time spent in the confessional from two in the morning, or earlier, until nine at night, would not be enough for him to hear the confessions of all the penitents who flocked to him.

At one time it seemed very unlikely that he would ever realise his wish to be a priest. One obstacle after another presented itself. During the French Revolution, the danger involved in such an ambition made his parents unwilling for him even to think about it. When liberty was again granted to the Church they withdrew their opposition, but his lack of education and his slowness in learning seemed to make it impossible that he would ever make any real progress in his studies.

So he made a vow to go on foot to pray at the tomb of St John Francis Regis. His prayers were answered, and he now made such progress that his tutor was astonished. However, his lack of formal education and what one biographer calls his 'backwardness' proved serious obstacles to his vocation. However, the Vicar-General (almost the equivalent of an archdeacon), hearing of his holiness and deep spiritual wisdom, said, "Very well, I will receive him: divine grace will do the rest.' He was ordained priest in 1815 and three years later became the parish priest of Ars.

His biographer says that there was nothing obviously attractive about him. He was short, awkward, and shy; and of the way he spoke it has been said that 'he was provincial to vulgarity; his pronunciation was akin to that of the peasant class from which he sprang,' and that he was a frequent offender 'against grammar and syntax, not to speak of literary taste, of which he did not so much as possess the rudiments'.

Yet his holiness of life, his tireless work, prayers and penances, brought about a complete reformation in his parish. Bad language, drunkenness and quarrelling ceased. Men and women were to be found praying in the church at two or three o'clock in the morning, and again at night after a hard day's work, while on Sundays there was scarcely room for the numbers who attended Mass.


A holy and truly saintly man, a model for parish priests someone who devoted himself and all his energies to serving God in the way he believed so passionately he had called him. But alongside all of that he was also someone who had a sense of humour. He said to one very talkative woman who had told him the same story many times: 'In which month do you speak least? It must be the month of February, because it has three days less in it than any other.'

St John Vianney's feast day is 4th August. This year, as that date is a Sunday, we don't observe his feast - but make a point of using it as an opportunity to pray especially for whoever God is calling to be our parish priest here.

Cuppa and Chat with Deacon Rachel

What's your name and where do you come from?

Susan Clarke, sometimes known as 'Sue or Susie' in her family was born in 1952 into an Army family, and like so many Army families had many homes. She lived in Bradford, London, Salisbury Godalming and the most exotic Singapore! Having thought she would train as a teacher Susan decided to train Cartography and worked as a draftswoman for some time. She worked at Guildford



Borough Council for some time, and it was in Guildford that Susan and Dennis met. When they moved to Worthing Susan volunteered in the Mind Charity shop on Goring Road.

Dennis Clarke was born in Blackpool in 1950 and describes himself as 'a miracle baby'! He studied History at Hull University after which he trained as a librarian in Liverpool. This wasn't for him and ended up working in the financial dimensions of an engineering department. After this Dennis worked for SPCK – a group running Christian Bookshops around the country - part-time for 20 years. He moved from the Northwest to Surbiton, Kingston on Thames and then to Guildford. Dennis' Mum moved to Worthing and lived in Clifton Road, and eventually Dennis and Susan decided to move from Guildford, to help care for her and they lived his Mum's before buying their own home.

What's your favourite food, drink, piece of music, tv programme and book?

Their favourite – it was a unanimous response – curry. Susan's favourite drink is water (there seems to be a theme here!) and Dennis' is Harvey's Old Ale. Sue likes to listen to Elgar, Mozart and Albinoni and Dennis enjoys listening to Lark Ascending and they both have a taste for John Bon Jovi. When it comes to television they enjoy watching documentaries and Inspector Maigret (both in English and in French!). With regards to their favourite books Susan often returns to the Shepherds Calendar by John Clare, a poem for each month of the year, a book she dips into time and again. The book which Dennis likes to return to is John Brunner's *The Squares of the City* (1965) which

'transposes the moves of a 1892 chess game between Wilhelm Steinitz (1836-1900) and Mikhail Chigorin (1850-1905) onto a near future landscape of political intrigue'

What are your interests?

Susan enjoys doing cross stitch. And they share an interest in reading. They both enjoy watching the Tour de France and Sumo wrestling! And Dennis particularly enjoys Rugby League.

What's your most memorable holiday?

One of Susan's most memorable holidays was a trip to Istanbul with friends on the Magic Bus and a holiday to Rhodes. And Dennis' two trips, one to Moscow to see the Lunar Space Station and a forty-eight hour round trip to Cologne – he thinks not to be repeated!! Two memorable holidays they have shared have been to to Marazion which is east of Penzance. Whilst there they were went to a play at the Minack Theatre, an outdoor theatre which has breath-taking views of the sea

What's your earliest memory of church?

Susan recalls a time when she was four or five walking down the aisle of the Congregational Church carrying a basket of violets and her Father dressed as a shepherd beside her. Dennis was brought up in the Roman Catholic church and being immersed in the liturgical ritual and calendar was enriching. He also remembers being prepared for his First Communion at quite a young age. During their younger years and after they married, they went to other churches: both Methodist and Church of England. Dennis' spiritual life has been influenced by the teachings and example of St Francis of Assisi and is now a Companion of the Society.

What drew you to St John's?

Dennis and Susan don't live in the parish (on the wrong side of one of the boundary roads). But, as their day to day lives take them in the direction of the Goring Road shops they were drawn to St John's.


