

We have a growing number of people from both churches joining our weekly Bible Study sessions where we study the




readings which will be used at Mass on the Sunday following the Bible Study.

Cuppa and Chat with Deacon Rachel

What's your name and where do you come from? Sheila Hillary born in 1937 near Tunbridge Wells and the first of four children. Memories of early years are shadowed by events of the war, especially living in an area which was in 'bomb alley'! She remembers two things: her mum saying 'if the siren goes off when you are out, go to the nearest house, they will look after you until the 'all clear' has been given; her mum receiving a telegram telling her that her brother and died in active duty—her mum's shock and tears are etched in her memory.



At 16 Sheila went to work in a convalescent home for children, valuable experience when she began her Registered Nurse training in Brighton. Sheila married and had four children and also offered fostering for newborn babies who were to be adopted. When asked, wasn't it hard to say goodbye to the babies, Sheila admitted although she missed them she was thankful for the privilege of providing love and stability for these little ones in the first weeks of their lives. Sheila also worked in nursing homes during her nursing career – the last being Pentlands.

What's your favourite food, drink, piece of music, tv programme and book?

Sheila likes most food, admitted to having a sweet tooth! But was clear she didn't care for pasta! Her favourite drink is water, loves it – always has a glass nearby. Sheila really enjoys musicals especially ones written by Andrew Lloyd Webber. She has quite wide taste in music so long as it's before the 60's. When it comes to the television, Sheila enjoys watching documentaries and had enjoyed the various programmes about D Day. However, television comes second to reading especially books by Stephanie Laurens.

What are your hobbies?

Reading without a doubt! Sheila said with a smile, that it was reading that had got her through the pandemic. She'll take herself off to bed early so that she can get on with her book!!

What's your most memorable holiday?

Sheila particularly enjoyed her holidays in the States with Roy and members of the family. Travelling in a car and staying in motels, she remembered sharing this huge room with her fellow travellers. She recalled buying a fridge for the car to keep water cool especially in the hotter regions they visited.

One memorable day out was a trip to the Ritz for afternoon tea. There she was in all her finery and as she looked around there were others dressed up but was amazed by how many people were dressed casually!!

What's your earliest memory of church?

Sheila was confirmed in her local church, St Thomas', Southborough, they didn't receive Holy Communion at the Confirmation, instead the following Sunday they had to get up for the 6am Holy Communion service (she didn't habitually go to that service!).

What drew you to St John's?

Sheila lived close to St John's as her children were growing up so she brought them along to Sunday School, which gave them a good grounding in the faith. She remembers with warmth and thankfulness the love and kindness shown to her after Roy died, and she now shares that same love and welcome to visitors to St John's.



Saint Thomas

Imagine you are sitting in church looking at the news letter and notice that 3rd July is St Thomas's feast day. You turn to your neighbour and ask 'What do you know about Thomas?' The reply you will probably get is 'One of the apostles, the one who doubted that Jesus had risen from the dead'. That is about one quarter of what St John tells us about him in his Gospel.

There is a verse in the long account of the raising of Lazarus that suggests that Thomas was a very courageous man. 2 days passed after Jesus found out that Lazarus was ill before he said to his disciples 'Let us go to him'. 'Too dangerous' they said. Bethany, where Lazarus lived, is very close to Jerusalem. 'It's not long since the Jews there wanted to stone you - you can't think of going back?' Thomas disagreed. 'Let us go, and die with him' - let us go with Jesus even if that means risking our lives too. Courage there.

And something else in his character: he was quite outspoken. When I conducted a lot of funerals I often found myself reading what happened when Jesus spoke about leaving his friends. 'I'm going to prepare a place for you' he says. And 'you know the way to the place where I am going'. Thomas interrupts: 'No. We don't know where you are going, so how can we know the way?'

Thomas - courageous, curious, direct; doubting yes, but only for a while. In the same way that he spoke out when the others hesitated before going with Jesus to visit Lazarus, and then voiced what the others were no doubt thinking when Jesus warned of his own death and promised them a place close to him for all eternity, so it was Thomas who, seeing the Risen Lord, made the great act of *faith* for which we should really remember him: 'My Lord and my God.' Thomas - the doubter no longer. Thomas - who shows his courage yet again as he says in front of his friends what he now believes and will continue to proclaim for the rest of his life.

Hasty judgements of other people - aren't we are all guilty of that from time to time. Thomas the Doubter? Or Thomas the Man of Courageous Faith? Let what we know of him be a warning!
