The Baptism of the Lord At the beginning of the Parish Mass today, in place of the usual confession water will be blessed and we will be sprinkled with it as a reminder of our own baptism. The response is *Cleanse and bless your Church*, O Lord. And during the sprinkling we sing hymn CHE 401

Today's readings In the 1st reading today the prophet Isaiah has words of hope for his people. Their time of exile to a foreign land, Babylon, is coming to an end: God is forgiving their faithlessness. The prophet gives them a picture of their route home - a 'straight highway' across the desert back to their homeland and the focus of their religion, the Temple at Jerusalem.

The second reading begins with verses we have heard recently - at the Midnight Mass of Christmas. Then we were rejoicing in the birth of God's Son, his gift of love to his people, the gift of one who would, as the angel revealed to Joseph, 'save his people from their sins'. Now the apostle asks us to understand what this means for those who 'turn to Christ' (as we did at our baptism): God's love is at work in us, renewing us with the gift of the Holy Spirit.

When St Luke tells of the baptism of Jesus he doesn't give an account of the actual event (as Matthew and Mark do), he simply tells us what happened immediately afterwards: that Jesus 'was praying'. As he prayed, the Holy Spirit, revealed in the form of a dove, descended on him and a voice from heaven identified him as God's Son, his beloved. Those words expressed the Father's approval of his Son's intended course of action: 'That is what it means to be my Son, to be my anointed One, to be my Servant.'
