**Today's readings** As we read the history of God's Chosen People we find that they go through periods of great hardship. Sometimes of their own making when they stray from the path God has set before them; other times when they are forced into periods of exile in foreign lands. These must have seemed to them like the end of the world. But, as in the passage from the book of Daniel we hear today, in these dark times there comes a message of hope and survival.

The last in our series of readings from the letter to the Hebrews also contains a message of great hope. While the high-priest in the Jerusalem Temple had to offer sacrifices daily for the forgiveness of his own sins and those of the people, Jesus, the new 'High Priest' made a perfect sacrifice once for all on the Cross of Calvary for the sins of all mankind. What hope that must give us as we journey through our lives on earth and into the eternal life of heaven

In the Gospel we hear Jesus's warnings of the 'end times', when 'heaven and earth will pass away'. There will, too, be an 'end time' for each one of us, so we must learn a lesson from the fig tree in the parable. Signs of illness or ageing remind us that our lives are finite. We hear so much about long-term health care, we are urged to make our wills, and other preparations for the future. But do we prepare ourselves spiritually, and ask that God will guide us to turn away from all that stands between ourselves and Him (we call that 'sin'), and between ourselves and other people (we call that 'reconciliation')?
