### The May Message

The working party did a great job of clearing weeds from the base of the church wall, it was instructed by our Architect as it could cause issues in the future. We just need some weed killer in the wall itself and the job will be complete. The next working party is going to be a sit down one, so if anyone would like to do some polishing or if you are a bit more able some wax removal from the carpet and chairs in church, please let me know.

The rest of this article looks at the news announced in church a couple of weeks ago regarding the future of the parish. Since September key members of the PCC have been meeting with the Archdeacon(s) (now a different one from when we started) to discuss the future of the parish. As many of you are aware the rate at which priests are retiring outweighs the number of priests being ordained, this leaves a short fall and parishes being left without. While some might be unsure about this, it actually has a number of benefits, such as shared resources, different events hosted by different people could lead to meeting new people and making new friends and the other churches didn't know we have a preschool, which might help with the number of children enrolling and/or be a good job opportunity for someone. Neither of the other two churches have a parish office, so our office could be open more often and we share things like the photocopier.

Anyway enough from me, this is what the Archdeacon has to say...

I am the Acting Archdeacon of Chichester (during the vacancy between Archdeacons of Chichester) and I have been meeting with the churchwardens and officers from St Andrew's Worthing, St Botolph's Heene, and St John the Divine West Worthing to discuss ministry in the parishes. It has been a great joy to get to know the wardens and others, to see these three magnificent church buildings, and to hear about the ministry and mission of each church community. We have been developing proposals that would retain the three separate parishes and three PCCs, which would come together as a united benefice with one fulltime priest as incumbent. The three churches each rejoice in their own rich and valued traditions, styles of worship, and approach to sacramental ministry. While fully retaining and respecting this diversity, a united benefice would allow the three churches to support a full-time priest leading the ministry of the benefice, and also share administration and mission. This is intended to secure longterm pastoral stability and continuity. The proposals would also seek the appointment of a second priest on a house-for-duty basis to work alongside the incumbent in the benefice. The proposals are being discussed by the three PCCs, and I look forward to continuing to work with the churchwardens and others in discerning where God is leading.

#### **EASTER WITH MARY**

St Ambrose was Bishop of Milan in the last years of the 4<sup>th</sup> century. He is one of a quartet of saints who are known as the Doctors of the Western Church, because of their holiness of life and their great learning. In one of his writings Ambrose refers to a tradition which was generally accepted in the Church of his time. It tells that, even before the Risen Lord appeared to Mary Magdalene in the garden on Easter Day, he visited his mother. Look for this story in the Gospels and you won't find it. But although none of the Gospel writers include it, there is a certain logic behind the tradition: having shown great concern for his mother as he hung dying on the cross (remember how he entrusted Mary to the care of St John), is it likely that Jesus would leave her without the great consolation of showing himself to her alive after his resurrection?

Because the story belongs to the church's tradition and has no scriptural evidence to back it up, we can choose either to accept it as likely, or reject it as unproven and unnecessary. That said, there can be no doubt at all about this: that Mary was in the company of the apostles during at least some of the time after the resurrection. The Acts of the Apostles tells us that after Jesus had ascended into heaven, the apostles and *some women, including Mary the mother of Jesus joined constantly in prayer* [Acts 1:14]. This is something we don't have the option to accept or reject at will, for it is attested by scripture.

Put the traditional story of Jesus appearing to his mother very early on Easter Day alongside the scriptural story telling how she spent time with the apostles after her Son's resurrection, and we can perhaps gain an insight into why we should have Mary very much in our minds in the weeks of Eastertide, and especially during this month of May.

The great Easter Proclamation which is sung at the Easter Vigil, asks 'Let this place resound with joy, echoing the mighty song of all God's people'. It reminds us that our celebration of Easter is a celebration in which we join with Christians everywhere - not only with Christians in many parts of the world as they celebrate Easter, but with Christians in every age, and with those in heaven as well. So as we share our joy with them, they share our joy with us; and as we share our joy with the Lord's Mother, she shares her joy, too, with us.

The verse from the Acts of the Apostles adds another dimension to this sharing: not only do we share with Christians everywhere and in every age the joy of the Lord's resurrection, but we also share in the whole Church's life of prayer as well. Mary waited, with the apostles, for the gift Jesus had promised, the gift of the Holy Spirit. And as they waited, they prayed. My experience is that it is an enormous encouragement if you know that others are praying with you: whether the prayer is the formal prayer of the Church, daily Morning and Evening Prayer, or the silent prayer of adoration like the one we have the opportunity for each Sunday evening, or a particular need you ask someone else to pray about or for which they ask your prayers. What a comfort to know that, if we want her to, Mary will pray with us - any time and for the things that are of most concern to us. Share the joy of Mary (just try and imagine the depth of her joy when the Son she had seen die, showed himself to her alive); and know the encouragement of prayer that is shared, as you ask her to pray with you and for you.



### **Cuppa and Chat with Deacon Rachel**

Ros was born in 1959 and lived in Great Baddow, Essex with her parents and older brother. All of her schooling was in the same area. Ros' father was diagnosed with cancer when she was only about three and he died when she was seven. During his illness he would travel to Hertfordshire for treatment, so he wasn't always around. Ros describes her memories of her dad as 'second-hand'. Whenever the family was together, they would share their memories of him which helped Ros create her own memories of him. Ros' mum had rheumatoid arthritis from quite a young age, but being a strong, resourceful and resilient lady was able to work in part time jobs and support the family.



Ros really enjoyed sport as a child and specifically basketball which she played to a high level whilst at school and into young adulthood. When Ros left school she went to the Teachers' Training College in Dartford, where she trained as a PE teacher. Her first teaching job was in Gravesend, during this time she played in the London Women's Basketball League and remembers travelling from Gravesend into London for matches, such was her dedication!

Ros met Phil whilst she was at Teachers' Training College, and they married in 1982. At that time Phil was running a pub in Brighton, and they lived there for a few years. Rather than teaching in the Brighton area Ros came to Worthing to teach PE at Chatsmore school (now Oscar Romero) where she taught for three years. Their careers meant that they didn't see each other much and so Phil left the licensing business and moved into IT. It was then they bought a house in Mile Oak, Portslade, which was near to the Downs with plenty of outdoor space to walk their dog.

Ros' mum was beginning to find life challenging and so she moved into their home in Mile Oak in around 1985.

In 1992 Ros, Phil, Kate (their eldest daughter) and her mum moved to their home in Worthing and soon after this they were joined by Rosie in 1993. The move out of the Brighton area meant Ros was able to take a teaching job in Brighton and she remained at Longhill until she retired in 2016. Whilst there she retrained as a Maths teacher and was also

influential in introducing the Health and Social Care GCSE. The move away from PE happened when she realised that she no longer had the same enthusiasm and dedication she had had – it was 'the thought of going out in the cold' for a lesson and enthusing the pupils to do the same!!

Ros looks back with great fondness on the relationship Kate, Rosie and Phil had with her mum. The girls would come home from school and 'play school' with Gran! They enjoyed sharing her biscuits and her polo mints! The girls became her eyes as she lost her sight and helped with her care in so many ways. She was missed when she died in 2001.

Ros' favourites:

Food – all things chocolate!

*Drink* – a good cup of coffee. Ros hinted at a really good coffee house in Worthing!!

Book - Ros confessed she doesn't read much – unless it is to learn something specific.

*Music* – Ros enjoys listening to 60's music and especially music she can sing along to, especially music which boosts the spirit.

Hobbies – creative cooking, baking (especially her cheese scones, which are a real hit), gardening, and skiing, walking and pilates.

Memorable holiday – or should I say holidays! When the girls were younger they had a wonderful Disney holiday in Florida and a holiday in Egypt which included a cruise down the Nile and time in Cairo. They all enjoyed being immersed in the history and culture of Egypt. And more recently a trip to New Zealand (North and South Islands) and a short stop in Singapore where Phil had spent some of his childhood.

As a child Ros would go to their local church with the family, this is where she and Phil also got married. When the girls were at school they started going to St John's. Ros' mum would go with them when she was able. And then Ros became involved with the youth group and also with the management of St John's Preschool, and the children's activity mornings. Now Ros and Phil enjoy being with their three grandchildren. Thank you Ros for making time to share some of your story with us. We look forward to hearing more!


