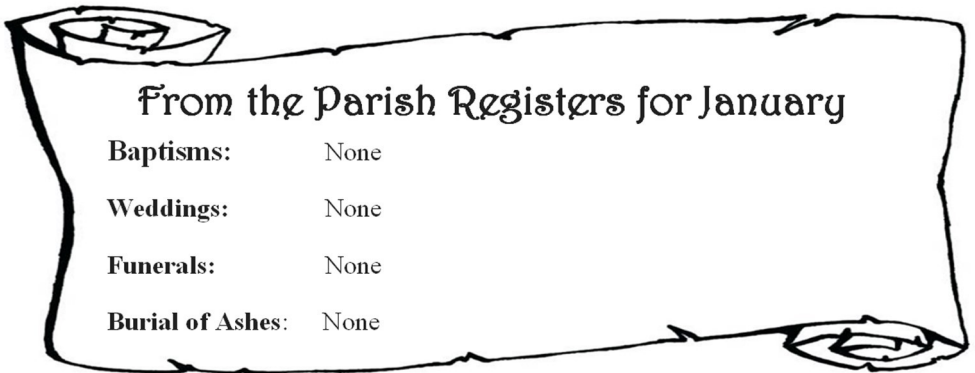

## March Messages from the Wardens

With winter seemingly coming to an end with some signs of spring showing, as we start to come out of hibernation, it's time to start getting a bit more active (in our own ways). The working parties are going to resume to get some general repairs and tidying carried out, in and around the church and hall.

One project that's recently come up is the church website. As many of you know Will and Wendy constructed the website a while ago and have carefully maintained it with new content and articles over the years. As with many pieces of software it has come to the end of its life and the website needs renewing. Over the next couple of months, we will be getting together to review the current content and update it and create new content to appeal to our everchanging world. If content editing or creation is something that might interest you, get in touch, even if you are not IT literate.

As we head into Lent and prepare for Easter some of us will also be preparing for the APCM. This year there will be a few changes in the PCC and some roles will become vacant. The PCC plays a vital role in the way the church functions. If you feel this is something you would like to be involved in speak to either Dorothy or myself.

In the Chichester Diocese this year, our Diocese is celebrating 950 years of Chichester Cathedral. The cathedral is hosting a number of events over the year. Parishes are encouraged to make pilgrimage to the Cathedral. St John's will make pilgrimage to the Cathedral later in the year, keep a look out for more details.

### **Hall updates.**

You may have noticed the absence of a Burns night this year. One of the reasons for this was that the cooker couldn't be reconnected after the kitchen floor was replaced as there isn't adequate ventilation in the kitchen for a commercial cooker.

The old cooker has now been sold and has gone to an events company that supports a lot of Christian events including our youth camps, so it's good to know it's gone to a good home. In the meantime, the hall committee will be looking to purchase a new domestic cooker that will meet the new gas requirements and events should start again soon.

## The Power of Persuasion

It all sounds so simple, doesn't it? An angel appears to a young woman (one evening as she is returning from the village well, legend tells us). The angel says she is to have a son and must name him Jesus. The young woman asks how? - she is not married. Don't worry about that, the angel reassures her, God will make it happen. She says 'I am the handmaid of the Lord - let it be as you have said.' End of conversation. The angel leaves. Yes, it does sound simple, doesn't it?

One of the early Church Fathers, St Irenaeus, puts a different gloss on the story. He says that the young woman, Mary, was '*persuaded* to be obedient to God'. 'Persuaded' - perhaps not quite so simple now. Although I have had no experience of it personally, I know how hard it may be to persuade a child to eat healthy greens, or a teenager to clean up an untidy bedroom. Even, dare I say (and this time I do speak from experience!) how hard it is sometimes to persuade a mature Christian to be faithful in his or her duties. In any of these, it is much easier to try and use force rather than gentle persuasion, to threaten rather than cajole. St Luke's account of the Annunciation to Mary suggests that the use of force and threats is not God's way; otherwise there would have been no need for the angel to *invite* Mary to be the mother of his Son - indeed, no need for him to give his Son to be born into the world and, in revealing how much God loves the world, to invite people to turn to him.

At the beginning of Mass on Ash Wednesday we hear these words: 'I invite you to the observance of a holy Lent, by self-examination and repentance; by prayer, fasting, and self-denial; and by reading and meditating on God's holy word.' No dire threats here; simply an invitation - to enter into all that Lent has to offer, to discover the positives, the joy of this holy season.

As Lent goes on, there is a further invitation - well two invitations, actually. To ponder with Mary on the mysterious visit of the angel to her, as we celebrate the Feast of the Annunciation on 25<sup>th</sup> of this month. And six days earlier to hear what happened when an angel came to St Joseph and asked him to be as courageous, obedient and faithful as the young woman to whom he was betrothed. On each of those days we hear how the invitation elicits the same response. Joseph did what the angel of the Lord had asked of him. Mary committed herself with the words 'let it be as you have said'. The invitation to each of us on those days is to turn to God with the same response on our lips as was on both of theirs: *I am the servant of the Lord; let what you want of me be done.*

For Joseph and Mary their response to God's invitation initiated a period of waiting. There would come a birth nine months later; unexpected visitors to receive and strange words to hear. And bit by bit they began to understand more about what God wanted of each of them.

As we enter into the season of Lent this year we continue to wait - for God to reveal his call to the priest he is choosing to be our future pastor. And for God to continue to reveal to us the part he is inviting each of us to play in the worship, life and mission of the church here, now and in the future. Simple - like the invitation Mary heard? Or Joseph became aware of in his dream and acted on as soon as he woke up? Probably - almost certainly - not! But our all-wise God has a plan he invites us to wait to discover and then be involved in. Mary said, Joseph said, we must say 'Yes, Lord, let it be as you have said.'

Ash Wednesday is 5<sup>th</sup> March: Mass with Imposition of Ashes at 11 am.

We keep St Joseph's Feast with Mass at 11 am on 19<sup>th</sup> March.

And the Annunciation on Tuesday 25<sup>th</sup> when Mass will also be at 11 am.

## Cuppa and Chat with Deacon Rachel

Mike Chatfield was born in Fishbourne in 1952 and has a brother Stephen and sister Jennifer. When Mike was born, his parents were waiting to move into a new house on the Parklands estate in Chichester, so it wasn't long before he was on the move. He went to the Central School in New Park Road and then on to Bishop Luffa Secondary School neither of which were far from home.



At the age of six Mike's cousin Frank invited him to join the servers' team at Bosham Parish Church. So, as a 'boat boy' he began his life as an altar server. When he was in his teens, he joined the team of altar servers at St Wilfrid's Church, Parklands. He remained there until he moved to West Worthing where, of course, he continues to be an altar server.

When Mike left Bishop Luffa he went to work 'on the railway', where he remained until his retirement forty years later. His first job was in the ticket office in Chichester. From there he moved to the Information Office and then to the Travel Centre. During this time, he had a six-month stint at the Horsham Office. Then he was moved to the Travel Centre in Oxford Street, London, where he was for 10 years and says it is probably his favourite post with British Rail. He met people from all over the world, helping them plan their holidays around the UK. Many of them were from America and didn't realise just how much there was to see and do in one city alone! During this time, he was given permission to act as a courier on day and long weekend excursions. British Rail would add a carriage to a scheduled train for these trips. Many of the weekend excursions were up to Scotland, visiting the lochs and mountains, a place dear to Mike's heart. After ten years the commute to London became too tiring and he returned to Chichester.

During the Second World War Mike's father had been a prisoner of war in Singapore and during this time he lost most of his eyesight. On his return to the UK he was cared for by St Dunstan's and they encouraged Mike's parents to move closer to Brighton, where their centre was. So they moved to Worthing.

Mike eventually bought a flat on the corner of Elm Grove and The Drive. He worked for some time in Brighton and finally in Croydon where he



became the Train Movements Manager for Victoria Station (ensuring that all incoming trains had a platform to arrive on!!). He reckons this is where he went grey and lost his hair! He said that one of the best things about working ‘on the railway’ at that time was that you were never out of work - they would always find you somewhere to work.

When Mike moved to Worthing, he was encouraged by the vicar of St Wilfrid’s Parklands to consider St John the Divine as a spiritual home. Before putting down roots at St John’s he visited a few churches in Worthing but didn’t feel at home. He felt that he entered and left a stranger. His experience at St John’s was so different. When Mike introduced himself to the Vicar, his response was ‘we’ve been expecting you!’ He no longer felt a stranger.

Mike met Teresa, his wife, on Pilgrimage to Walsingham. Not many couples can say that they got engaged in the Holy House. They were married in November 1999 and having acquired a ready-made family, Mike became a Grandad a week into marriage!

Mike’s favourites

*Food* – loves curry, the hotter the better, and of course good home cooking.

*Drink* – calls himself a ‘tea snob’, will only drink loose tea and knows the best tea rooms in the area. He likes a pint with his curry, a weekly event with a fellow server, and ‘single malt whiskey’.

*Book* – he confesses he isn’t an avid reader but enjoys dipping into travel guides and non-fiction books.

*Music* – he enjoys classical music, especially Baroque and organ music.

*TV* – he likes watching documentaries and keeping up with the news.

*Most memorable holidays* – in his younger years he really enjoyed cycling and walking holidays in Scotland and the Southwest of England. He once walked the coastal path from Minehead to Poole, what a feat. The two most memorable holidays with Teresa have been a trip to New Zealand and then to Canada and Alaska. He combines his holidays with a favourite hobby of photography.

Thank you, Mike, for sharing some of your story with us. It isn’t every parish congregation that can celebrate having a railway timetable expert and travel arranger! Mike, we look forward to hearing more of your story.

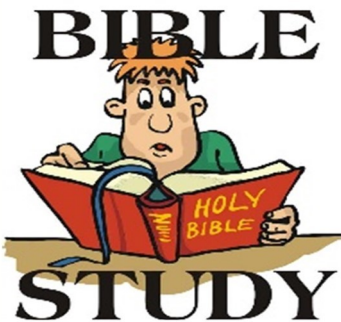
