**Today's readings** The 1<sup>st</sup> reading tells part of the story of the call of Abraham. In obedience to what God has asked of him he has uprooted his wife and family and all his belongings, and moved them to a distant country. Now he is asking for some assurance that his obedience will be rewarded. The powerful sign God gives not only assures him, but makes a covenant, a solemn and binding agreement, with him and his descendants.

Having heard of Abraham's trust, the 2<sup>nd</sup> reading begins by giving us a warning about the consequences of the opposite. The people, who, unfortunately, do not have faith or trust in God, are, says St Paul, 'enemies of the cross of Christ'. Those who do remain faithful, though, are already 'citizens of heaven' and will see their existence transfigured into the likeness of the risen Christ. So the apostle encourages us to 'stand firm' in our faith, and trust in the Lord.

The Gospel gives us the familiar story of the Transfiguration of Jesus. He has warned his friends that discipleship will be costly: they will be required to 'take up their cross and follow' him. Now he takes three of them aside and gives them a glimpse of the reward that is in store for those who do remain faithful. On the mountain they see their Lord in glory. What Peter, John and James experience there for just a short while will become for all who remain faithful their (our) eternal destiny.
